# From the Principal

#### **Staffing**

Sheena Scott, one of our valued teachers who has been on extended leave, has now resigned her position. We thank her very much for her contribution to our students and school and sincerely wish her all the very best in her future endeavours.

This year we have welcomed four new staff members, teachers Mrs Kaelee Edwards in N5, Ms Bianca Reynolds in N2 and Mrs Paula Rodrigues in W3, and School Psychologist Mrs Karli Budge. Mrs Budge will work on Wednesdays and our existing Psychologist Mrs Kate Hanley will work on Thursdays only.

#### **School Attendance**

A reminder that our school operating times are 8:40 a.m. until 2:50 p.m. Students arriving after 8:40 am need to sign-in through the front office for a late pass. If you need to collect your child early for an appointment, please send a message to the teacher and contact the office. Only contacts that are listed on the student records are authorised to pick up the student. Our staff may request ID to be shown prior to releasing a student, if the person collecting is not known to them. Please update the office with any changes to contact details.

#### **Assemblies**

Our whole school assemblies for Pre-primary to Year 6 will be held on Friday mornings at 9 a.m. To minimise the impact to student's learning, these will be held less frequently. As per the Term One planner, our first assembly for this term will be held on Friday 23 February and will be hosted by our wonderful 2024 Student Councillors.

#### Safer Internet Day

Last Tuesday 6 February was Safer Internet Day, a global initiative to raise awareness of online safety issues. The eSafety Commissioner leads the initiative in Australia, with the eSafety Commission committed to educating people about how to be safe online and where to go for help if needed. The message for this year's Safer Internet Day is to take three simple actions when approaching online safety: Connect. Reflect. Protect.

**Connect** safely by keeping apps and devices secure and reviewing your privacy settings regularly.

**Reflect** on how your actions online may affect others or your safety.

**Protect** yourself and others by visiting eSafety.gov.au to find out how to stay safe online and report online abuse.

#### On Entry Assessments for Pre-primary

For the next four weeks, teachers assess each Pre-primary student's skills and understandings of oral language, reading, writing and numeracy. Teachers will conduct the assessment one-on-one with each child. The information provided enables the teacher to plan for the learning needs of every child, including those who may need additional support or extension.

Many children who start school with limited skills progress quickly when provided with the right support. As children progress, their needs may change. Teachers continually monitor their students' progress to ensure the changing needs of every child are met. After the assessment period, all parents of Pre-primary students will receive a summary that includes the skills and understandings that their child demonstrated.

You do not need to prepare your child for the assessment; however, we encourage you to support your child's learning at home. You can use these resources and activities with your child:

#### **Naplan**

Students in Years 3 and 5 will participate in the NAPLAN (National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy) Online assessment, commencing Wednesday 13 March and concluding on Monday 25 March. Students are being provided with opportunities to become familiar with the online platform and their teaching and learning program provides the required preparation needed for students to participate.

All students are to please ensure they arrive to school punctually each day. If your child is unwell, please do not send them to school to sit the test. We will make every effort to provide students with catch up tests on their return to school if it is within the testing window.

#### **Play Equipment**

Play equipment at school is for use by our students during the school day when supervised by staff. All playgrounds are not to be used before or after school. Thank you for your understanding and support.

#### **Ride to School Day Sausage Sizzle**

Ride to School Day is on Friday 22 March, in week 8. Students are encouraged to ride to school on this day. To celebrate we will be holding a free sausage sizzle. Breakfast Club will therefore not be open on this day.

# After School Arrangements

#### **After School Care Arrangements for Late Collection of Students**

Our school day for students ends at 2:50 p.m. Our wonderful school office staff do not have duty of care. Please make alternative arrangements for the collection of your child if you know you are going to be late. One option is OSHClub, our onsite before and after school care provider.

Enrolment in OSHClub is free, so it's a good idea to enrol now, just in case you need it throughout the year.

A few things you may not have known about OSHClub:

- Before and after school care is eligible for childcare subsidy, meaning the government may fund up to 90% of the session fee\*
- Holiday programs are also eligible for childcare subsidy, and your child is welcome to join the program at your school or another OSHClub location.

## Welcome to our new staff




1 - Karli Budge - School Psychologist

All students from Kindy to Year 6 visit the library once per week with their class to borrow library books. The library is a perfect place to encourage and develop a love of books. Borrowing also fosters responsibility, by having students look after the books in their care and remembering to return or renew their books every week. Please ensure your child has a library bag, to assist in keeping our books safe.

Our library is open before and after school, to allow students and families the opportunity to swap or return books outside of their class library time. It is also open on Tuesday and Thursday lunchtimes, for year 1-6. Students can come and enjoy quiet reading, colouring or play a game.

#### **Scholastic Book Club**

Twice per term you will receive a Scholastic Book Club catalogue. Ordering can be done online through LOOP or cash can be placed into the Book Club box in the library. Books arrive approximately 2 weeks from the final order date. These will then be delivered to your child's classroom. The school earns commission from sales which is used to purchase new books for the library.

# **Information from Transperth**



The Ride to School Free Program started on Monday 5 February 2024. Find all the details on the Transperth website.

#### Metropolitan area and towns where Smartriders are used

In the metropolitan area and in towns where Smartriders are used, students with a valid Student SmartRider will be able to travel for free on Transperth or Transregional services for any journey Monday to Friday, until the end of the school year.

Students must tag on and off each journey to receive the free travel or they will receive a default fare. If their SmartRider goes into a negative balance as a result, they will not have access to free travel.

Students attending schools located near the Armadale/Thornlie Line have previously received information about Shutdown free travel passes. Students can now access their free travel using their SmartRider instead.

Fare-free Sundays

Fare-free Sundays will be available to everyone with a valid SmartRider card. Fare-free Sundays start on 4 February.

#### Non-Smartrider towns

In towns where SmartRiders are not used, tickets will no longer be required.

#### Students who don't have SmartRiders

Some school students don't get their Student SmartRiders until the end of February. If a student does not have a SmartRider on 5 February they will be allowed to travel for free without a valid ticket, however, from 1 March students must have their Student SmartRider to travel for free or purchase a cash ticket.

When students have received their Student SmartRider they should start using it immediately by tagging on and off each journey to avoid their SmartRider failing to activate.


